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
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
Our K4 friend, A'Nisha, was all tucked in and ready for nap time after lunch!

## "Celebrating Differences"










Just like there are different languages that people can speak, there are also different types of sign language that people can use. One common type of sign language is American Sign Language, or ASL.





PLEASE With an open palm, draw a circle clockwise on your




With an open hand, place your finaertips
